### **Kate Tully (Chair)**

Kate Tully is Chair of the QCOSS Board. Kate is an experienced nonprofit professional; her subject expertise focuses on issues impacting women and girls, while her functional areas of interest include governance, strategy and change management. Kate has been an active member of governing and advisory bodies for more than 20 years, including the Ethics Review Committee of Royal Prince Alfred Hospital and Premiers Council for Women (NSW). She is currently a member of the Queensland Plan Ambassadors Council. Kate is the Head of College at Duchesne College (a residential college for women within the University of Queensland), and also serves as Company Secretary of YWCA Queensland.

### **Nadia Currie (special skills member)**

Nadia has served on several committees and advisory groups including the Aboriginal Suicides and Mental Health Committee at the Hunter Institute for Mental Health, The National Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation Budget Steering Committee and served as Chair, Patient Journey Working Committee for the Aboriginal Health Council of Western Australia. She holds a Bachelor of Laws and is due to complete her Masters of Law in July 2018.

As the Operations Manager at QATSICPP, Nadia encourages social change and transformational leadership – not only within QATSICPP, but to the broader workforce and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, young people and families. This entails ensuring the voices of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and young people in out-of-home care are heard and further represented to achieve equity and access to services.

As QCOSS and QATSICPP share a common goal in ensuring the voices of those needed are heard and represented accordingly. Thus, Nadia's interest in participating on the QCOSS Board of Directors would ensure robust discussion pertaining to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander social determinants as she has had previous experience in native title, stolen generation linkage, housing and health, with the ability to broaden the scope and speak generally.
